

Defend Your Right to Vote on BIG Development in King Harbor

The fight continues for Redondo's future

The Redondo Beach City Council will vote on Tuesday, February 16th, to allow 400,000 square feet of additional development in King Harbor - including three-story time-shares. This is a 40 percent increase over what is already there and will create traffic gridlock per the City's own study.

Do we want another massive eyesore on our waterfront without a vote?

The City Charter should require a public vote before this can happen, but the City Council (except Councilmember Brand) ignores this law.

They claim the zoning is already effective. This is NOT true! According to State law and their own ordinance, the zoning is not effective until certified by the Coastal Commission. And that shouldn't happen until you get to vote!
