

No New Power Plant in Redondo

California law requires the existing AES Redondo Beach Power Plant be decommissioned or replaced. **AES has submitted its plan to rebuild a NEW power plant in Redondo.**

**LET'S
STOP IT!**

WHY WE DO NOT NEED IT

- The City's own studies call the power plant "the major blighting influence" in the Redondo harbor area.
- California Watch has listed our power plant as one of the top 100 air polluters in the state, despite its limited running times.
- No longer required - a 2008 report released from the California Energy Commission shows that AES ran sporadically at 5% of its total capacity. It supplied less than 1/10th of 1 percent of our power. A 2010 report cites the addition of new power sources to the grid and calls out that El Segundo and Huntington Beach power plants are required, but it does NOT call out the Redondo plant as a required source of power.

HOW WE CAN STOP A NEW PLANT AND MAKE BETTER USE OF OUR WATERFRONT

- The Redondo City Council can rezone the property to prevent the rebuilding.
- Residents can lead an initiative to replace the current industrial use zoning with a mixed park/business/institutional use.

TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE

It will take us over a year to get an initiative in place. AES expects their new permit to be approved by October 2013. The timing is already tight!
